Wall-Mounted vs. Built-In vs. Pull-Out

A concise B2B comparison for cabinet manufacturers, hospitality projects and distributors.

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Which ironing board format fits the project?

Criteria	180° wall-mounted	Built-in cabinet	Folding pull-out
Storage	Double-folded against wall	Vertical inside cabinet	Folded inside cabinet hardware
Movement	180° swivel	180° horizontal positioning; vertical storage	Pull-out, folding and up to 180° rotation
Reference size	950 × 300 × 185 mm	Board 810 × 335 × 25 mm	Open approx. 956 × 710 × 110 mm
Cabinet / wall planning	Structural wall or reinforced panel	Min. 449 mm clear width; approx. 1480 mm vertical clearance	Stored approx. 500 × 350 × 110 mm
Typical fit	Hotels, apartments, laundry rooms	Wardrobes, closets and fitted cabinetry	Cabinet and wardrobe pull-outs
Service access	Cover and wall mechanism	Cover, frame and vertical mechanism	Cover, rails, joints and rotation mechanism

Selection rule

Choose wall-mounted when a permanent wall station and flexible positioning are priorities. Choose built-in when vertical concealment inside a tall cabinet is available. Choose pull-out when the ironing station must be integrated into cabinet hardware and pulled into the room for use.

Questions to resolve before selection

- What clear width, height, depth and projection are available?
- Where is the structural fixing zone?
- Do doors, hinges, drawers or shelves enter the movement envelope?
- Who will use and service the product?
- Which drawings, inspection records and destination documents are required?

Confirm the current drawing and order configuration before final specification.
